Martinet Legal Society, Inc. and Martinet Legal Foundation, is a Past President of the New Orleans Association for Women Attorneys, and is Past Chair of the New Orleans Bar Association's Young Lawyers Committee's Public Service Committee. Within the New Orleans Chapter of the Federal Bar Association, Camille serves on the Young Lawyers Division Board of Directors.

Locally, she serves on the Board of Directors for Southeast Louisiana Legal Services (SLLS), and she currently Co-Chairs the Membership Development Committee of the Junior League of New Orleans. Camille is also a past Board Member of Kids ReThink New Orleans Schools.
