As McGlinchey Stafford's 2019 Diversity Fellows, Sonam and Andrew participated in the Leadership Council on Legal Diversity (LCLD) Scholars Summit, June 4-6 in Atlanta, GA. The event brings together diverse law students from around the country to hone interview skills, prepare for the transition from law student to practicing lawyer, and discuss the state of diversity in the legal profession.
