

# “Yes, there really are 50 of them” Online Lending State Licensing and Examination Challenges

The various online lending models don't always fit neatly into existing state laws. State regulators and Attorneys General have taken various approaches to try to regulate online lending, sometimes through aggressive enforcement postures and other times through simply amending their laws. State regulators are partnering on multistate examinations, but is the multistate framework helping or hurting?
